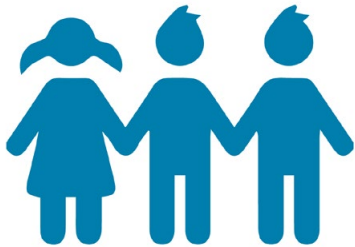

OUR THREE PROGRAMS ARE THE HEART OF OUR ORGANIZATION.

There are many hardships a family experiences after a pediatric cancer diagnosis. For the child with cancer, it can be physically painful and scary. Many children also struggle in school due to the side effects of treatment. For parents, it is the most frightening and emotionally exhausting make singular of their lives. Many families lose income while seeing their child through treatment, causing significant financial stress. Teddy Bear Cancer Foundation addresses all of these issues.

We offer programs to lessen the immediate financial, emotional, and educational challenges, while providing ongoing opportunities for families to connect with each other in a safe space.

THE FAMILY FUND: FINANCIAL STABILITY PROGRAM

THE FAMILY FUND: *Financial Stability Program*

Low-to-moderate income families can receive help with household bills and expenses associated with caring for a sick child. Funds also help offset the loss of income due to one or both parents reducing work hours or leaving their job to care for their child.

DIRECT FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE FUND

Low-to-moderate income families can ease their immediate financial burden by applying for up to \$5,000 for payment of rent or mortgage, auto expenses, utility bills, medications, home care services, food, child care, or hotel accommodations.

RELAPSE FUND

If a child's cancer returns, families can request an additional \$2,500 of financial support.

FUNERAL FUND

We assist families with up to \$2,500 to cover the costs of funeral arrangements.



Karla and John lived in Ventura when their 18-month-old daughter, Grace, began displaying unusual behavior. In December 2016, they were told Grace had ependymoma, a type of brain tumor. After diagnosis, Grace was immediately rushed to Children's Hospital Los Angeles (CHLA) for emergency surgery and medical attention. Before her diagnoses, their family's finances were stable. John worked a steady job, while Karla, who was expecting their fourth child, stayed home and cared for their children.

When their new reality struck, John was forced to take months off work to be there for his family. Completely overwhelmed, they lost their home in Ventura. This is when their CHLA social worker told them about TBCF's services. Once TBCF stepped in, Karla said, "That's when our new story began. Because of TBCF's Financial Stability Program, we were able to move into a home in Santa Barbara. We went from feeling hopeless, having no money and no one to call, to having peace of mind and hope again."

"Teddy Bear Cancer Foundation's services are vital to helping families stay afloat during the medical crisis of a cancer diagnosis. HELP FOR THE HEART:

Emotional Support Program

TBCF provides professional and peer support for the entire family, including parents, the child in treatment, and their siblings to ease emotional hardship.

FAMILY COUNSELING GROUPS

Supportive services in collaboration with local organizations and licensed professionals for families during the varying stages of their child's treatment.

"BEAR" NECESSITIES

Items for families such as furniture, appliances, clothing, bedding, and hospital care packages are provided to families in need.

FAMILY CONNECTION EVENTS

Family Fun Days, trips for children and their families, and holiday parties are created to offer a safe environment for families to gain support from and connect with one another.

CARE FOR THE CAREGIVERS

Allows parents and guardians to build a sense of camaraderie and engage in self-care. Events such as Mother's Spa Day provide rest and rejuvenation for caregivers of children with cancer.

PROJECT HOLIDAY

Families of children in treatment can participate in Project Holiday to receive Christmas gifts, Easter baskets, Thanksgiving dinners, Valentine's Day cards, grocery vouchers, and more! All items are provided by donors and delivered to the families' home or child's treatment location.





In a matter of months, eight-year-old Camila's entire world changed.

She noticed her vision began to blur when looking at the board at school. In 2016, after receiving an MRI, she was diagnosed with optic glioma. Camila lost her sight soon after her diagnoses and began the journey of navigating these major transitions in her life.

Camila and her family are regular attendees of our collaborative Santa Maria Family Counseling Groups at Mission Hope Cancer Center, which has had a great impact on their lives. "We have been able to form bonds with other parents, which is encouraging, especially on days that seem gloomy. Our doubts and fears have decreased thanks to the support of the surrounding families and facilitators," shared Camila's mom, Leticia.

"Camila benefits from the loving assistance from

the other children in group, her brother who also attends, as well as the TBCF staff and Mission Hope facilitators who are by her side with encouraging words. Her parents also benefit from the counselors and oncology nurse who are present at each counseling session in order to address any medical concerns they may have", explained Jennifer Davis, Oncology Counselor and Patient Advocate from Marian Cancer Care.

Camila is currently in remission and is learning how to read braille. Nothing stops her!



TOOLS FOR SCHOOL: *Educational Advocacy Program*

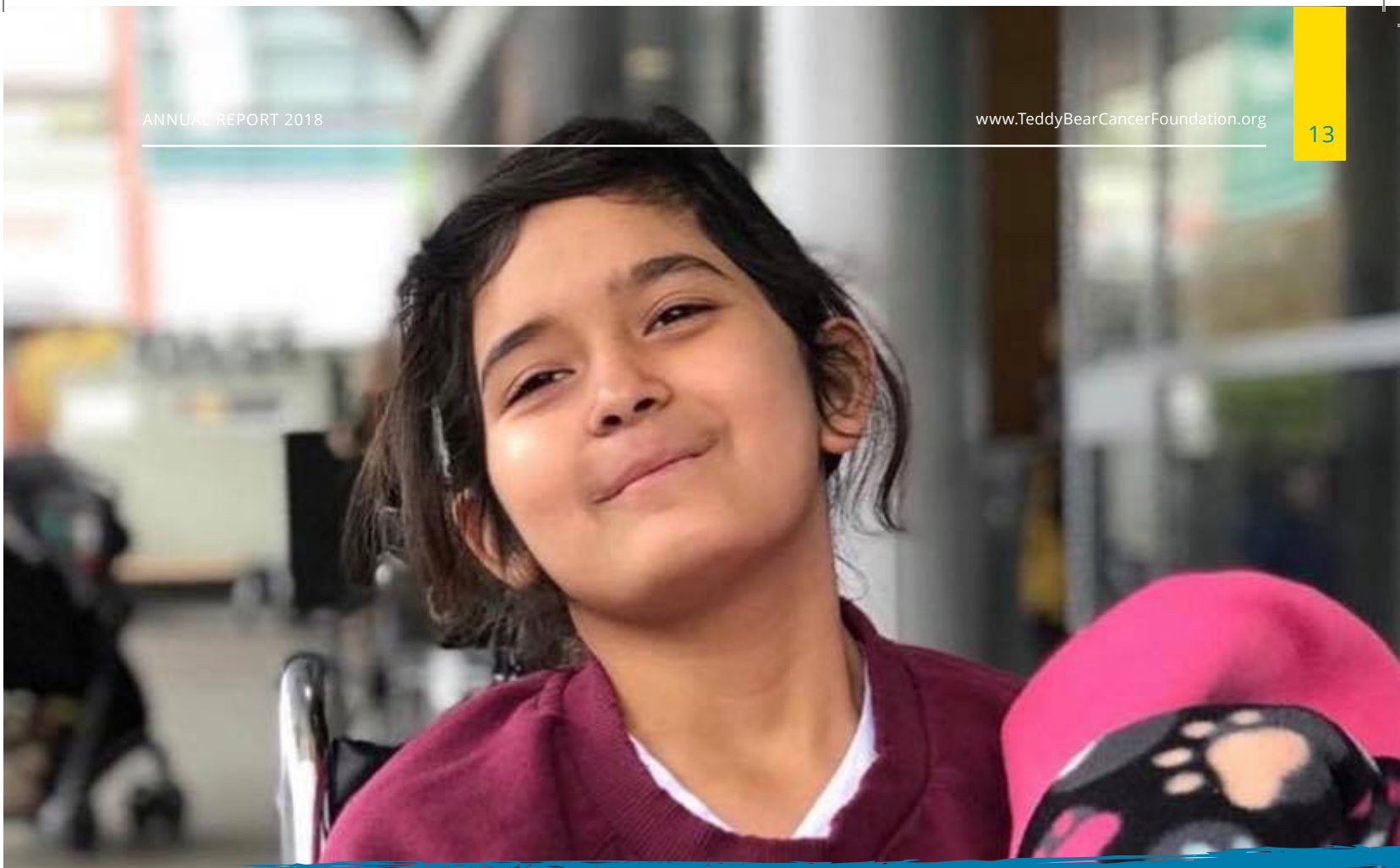
This program gives parents the necessary tools to support and advocate for their child's academic career and provides a smooth transition back to school following treatment.

NEUROPSYCHOLOGICAL TESTING

To help families address the learning difficulties associated with cancer treatment, TBCF covers up to \$1,500 for neuropsychological testing. Test results are used to better understand and effectively advocate for their child's academic needs.

TUTORING SERVICES

Youth and young adults in need of individualized academic support are provided \$500 in tutoring services by accredited teachers. This program is recommended for those in maintenance or remission.



When ten-year-old Felicity walked out of her fifth-grade class in Ventura County in November 2015,

she never imagined she wouldn't be returning to school for the next two years. On November 18, 2015, Felicity was diagnosed with leukemia and her daily routine quickly transitioned to fighting for her life.

Her studies consisted of working with a home hospital teacher on a weekly basis, provided she wasn't too sick to meet. When she was well enough to return to school, TBCF was there to cover the cost of an in-depth neuropsychological test through our Educational Advocacy Program which assessed the impact of chemotherapy on her development and learning. Test results provided a case for an Individualized Education Plan to be developed so that she could attend special education classes.

TBCF additionally covered the expenses of a state-credentialed teacher to provide tutoring for Felicity.

"Despite the enduring trauma her body had been through, Felicity always showed up with a smile and excitement to see what new learning adventures awaited her. It was more than just assistance with the academic transition; it was a time to listen, guide and validate the multitude of feelings that surrounded her as she was trying to live life as a child again," shared Felicity's tutor, Tyra.

"If she hadn't receive the extra help, she would have had a much harder time. She is now in remission and receiving A's and B's in her 8th grade classes in middle school!", said Felicity's mom, Victoria.

A pediatric cancer diagnosis can cause emotional challenges, educational hurdles, and financial difficulties for families. Parents often must take a substantial amount of time off work or quit their job to be with their child in the hospital, resulting in a significant loss of income. This is when we step in to help the families.

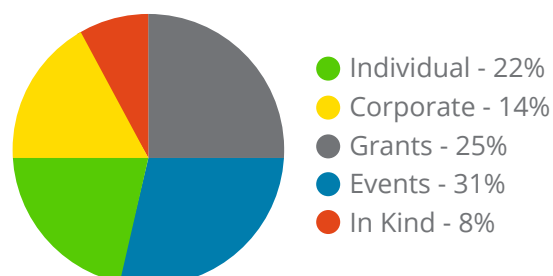

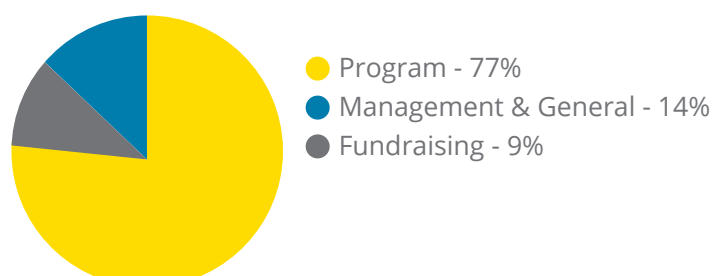
